VIRGINIA GIRLS CHOIR

The Virginia Girls Choir, founded at St. Stephen's in 2008, is an auditioned group of girls in grades three through twelve who come from across the greater Richmond area. The girls work to sing with spirit and understanding in a variety of musical styles, with the music of the Anglican tradition taking pride of place in their repertoire. The girls come from a wide array of schools and cultural and family backgrounds. Great care is taken to ensure that all members of the traveling choir, whose participation requires a large commitment of time and dedication, can take part in performances, tours and other activities. These are funded not by the parish budget but by individual gifts.

FAIRFIELD COURT ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

St. Stephen's and Fairfield School enjoy a close and fruitful partnership that includes direct involvement by many of our parishioners as lunch buddies, classroom helpers and other volunteer roles. Despite the challenges faced by the residents of the Fairfield Court housing project in the East End, a dedicated staff, involved parents, motivated students and our hands-on support have made Fairfield one of the most successful elementary schools in the City of Richmond.

PETER PAUL DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Peter Paul Development Center provides an academic after-school and summer program for students in grades 2-12, parent programming, community engagement through Richmond Promise Neighborhood, twice-weekly daytime activities for senior citizens, and twice-monthly food distribution. The roots of the Episcopal Church are deeply planted in the center, and St. Stephen's relationship with Peter Paul is a longstanding and rich one. This marks the sixth year of an expansion program made possible by St. Stephen's to incorporate Peter Paul's after school program at nearby Fairfield Court Elementary School. The Fairfield expansion was a launching pad for a recent expansion into George Mason Elementary School for an after school program. In total, PPDC serves nearly 300 students (160 on-site, 60 off-site at Fairfield

Court Elementary School, and 60 off-site at George Mason Elementary School)

as well as their parents, 60 senior citizens, and more than 2,600 individuals who use the food distribution program. Your gift, large or small, helps Peter Paul transform the lives of families in Richmond's East End.

Anna Julia Cooper Episcopal School is an independent, faith-based middle school providing full-tuition scholarships to students of limited economic resources, primarily from Richmond's East End. Through a program focused on the whole child, the school helps empower students and graduates to change the trajectory of their lives, setting their sights on success in high school, college, and serving their communities. Anna Julia Cooper School values all staff, parents and volunteers as integral to its success as a school and a "community of affection."

ACTS is a Greater Richmond interfaith mission which provides support and resources to our neighbors in financial crisis, enabling them to live sustainable, self-sufficient and dignified lives. ACTS provides rent, mortgage and utility assistance as well as other support and resources or referrals to more appropriate agencies that make it possible for those in crisis to stay in their homes and avoid homelessness.

ST. STEPHEN'S FOOD MINISTRY

The food ministry at St. Stephen's is inspired by the Eucharist, the central act of worship in the Christian faith. Through the Eucharist, Christians are fed by God so that they can feed

others. Our food ministry is designed to transform this belief into practice by offering programs that help people lead healthier lives that make them better stewards of God's creation. This ministry helps to feed the hungry in many different ways.



Food Pantry: St. Stephen's food pantry provides nourishing foods to those in the community who cannot afford them. We collect non-perishable food for those in need, and each Monday afternoon from

1:00 until 3:00, we welcome individuals into our pantry to choose foods they need to feed themselves and their families.

Fruit Ministry: Fruit Ministry volunteers meet at church at 9 a.m. every Monday to sort and deliver fresh fruit to over 200 residents of Richmond's Gilpin Court neighborhood and Highland Park. Without this ministry, the people we serve would not have access to fresh fruit of any kind.

DOMINICAN REPUBLIC

St. Stephen's has been involved in the Dominican Republic for many years, working with the local Episcopal diocese and other Episcopal leaders. Our relationships are focused in the southwestern city of Azua, where the partnered congregations of Reconciliacion and San Jorge provide basic necessities amidst a vibrant church life. Our mission teams join those efforts, helping provide and improve basic necessities like health care and shelter where poverty and disease present daily hurdles.

We send a team of medical and dental professionals to Azua for a week each year, and senior high youth to run Vacation Bible School.
