VIRGINIA GIRLS CHOIR

The Virginia Girls Choir, founded at St. Stephen's in 2008, is an auditioned group of girls in grades three through twelve who come from across the greater Richmond area. The girls work to sing with spirit and understanding in a variety of musical styles, with the music of the Anglican tradition taking pride of place in their repertoire. The girls come from a wide array of schools and cultural and family backgrounds. Great care is taken to ensure that all members of the traveling choir, whose participation requires a large commitment of time and dedication, can take part in performances, tours and other activities. These are funded not by the parish budget but by individual gifts.

PETER PAUL DEVELOPMENT CENTER

Peter Paul Development Center provides an academic after-school and summer program for students in grades 2-12, parent programming, community engagement through Richmond Promise Neighborhood, twice-weekly daytime activities for senior citizens, and twice-monthly , with Peter Provide the second secon food distribution. The roots of the Episcopal Church are deeply planted in the center, and St. Stephen's relationship with Peter Paul is a longstanding and rich one. This marks the eighth year of an expansion after school program at nearby Fairfield Court Elementary School. The

ANNA JULIA COOPER EPISCOPAL SCHOOL

Anna Julia Cooper Episcopal School is an independent, faith-based middle school providing full-tuition scholarships to students of limited economic resources, primarily from Richmond's East End. Through a program focused on the whole child, the school helps empower students and graduates to change the trajectory of their lives, setting their sights on success in high school, college, and serving their communities. Anna Julia Cooper School values all staff, parents and volunteers as integral to its success as a school and a "community of affection."

AREA CONGREGATIONS TOGETHER IN SERVICE (ACTS)

ACTS is a Greater Richmond interfaith mission which provides support and resources to our neighbors in financial crisis, enabling them to live sustainable, self-sufficient and dignified lives. ACTS provides rent, mortgage and utility assistance as well as other support and resources or referrals to more appropriate agencies that make it possible for those in crisis to stay in their homes and avoid homelessness.

RE:work RICHMOND

St. Stephen's has partnered with St. Peter's Episcopal Church in Church Hill to form RE:work RICHMOND, an organization which takes a comprehensive, "high touch" approach to working with families in the East End. While the services provided by RE:work will be comprehensive, its initial focus is employment assistance, based on the needs expressed by people who live in the East End, and whom we have come to know through our long-standing relationships with the Peter Paul Development Center, FairfieldCourtElementarySchool, and Anna Julia Cooper Episcopal School; and by St. Peter's Church, whose members have walked throughout the neighborhood with their pastor to learn from residents what their greatest challenges are.

All clients will come to RE:work through recommendations from these partners, as well as from Armstrong High School and local churches. The pilot cohort will be comprised of 20 families representing a broad range of socioeconomic circumstances.

ST. STEPHEN'S FOOD MINISTRY

The food ministry at St. Stephen's is inspired by the Eucharist, the central act of worship in the Christian faith. Through the Eucharist, Christians are fed by God so that they can feed others. Our food ministry is designed to transform this belief into practice by offering programs that help people lead healthier lives that make them better stewards of God's creation. This ministry helps to feed the hungry in many different ways.

Food Pantry: St. Stephen's food pantry provides nourishing foods to those in the community who cannot afford them. We collect non-perishable food for those in need, and each Monday afternoon from 1:00 until 3:00, we welcome individuals into our pantry to choose foods they need to feed themselves and their families.

Fruit Ministry: Fruit Ministry volunteers meet at church at 9 a.m. every Monday to sort and deliver fresh fruit to over 200 residents of Richmond's Gilpin Court neighborhood and Highland Park. Without this ministry, the people we serve would not have access to fresh fruit of any kind.

Sunday Community Suppers: Our Sunday Community Suppers have become a time for fellowship, delicious, healthy meals, and for some, the only nutritious food they will have all week.
