## Our celebration of 50 years of women in the priesthood continues today

This weekend we have been marking the 50th anniversary of the first ordinations of women as Episcopal priests, not only with activities but with the presence and participation of clergy who have served at St. Stephen's Church in the past. On Friday, a screening of "The Philadelphia Eleven" included a post-film panel discussion with the Rev. Cate Anthony, the Rev. Whitney Edwards, and the Rev. Claudia Merritt. Yesterday, Cate led a half-day retreat followed by a luncheon hosted by the Women of St. Stephen's.

Today we are delighted to have the Rev. Margaret Austin, the Rev. Weezie Blanchard, and the Rev. Penny Nash with us. Weezie is our guest preacher at the 9 and 11:15 a.m. services, and she and Margaret will join Cate in the Sunday Forum. This evening the Rev. Penny Nash, well known to our Sunday evening community, will give the reflection at the 5:30 p.m. service.

## Next Sunday: the Bishop's visit

Each year St. Stephen's Church receives a visit from one of our bishops. Next Sunday, May 5, the Rt. Rev. E. Mark Stevenson, our diocesan bishop, will be here to preach and celebrate the Eucharist at the 9 and 11:15 a.m. services, and to confirm, receive, or reaffirm adults and youth. This will be a moving celebration. Join us!

We're making plans for this summer's Vacation Bible School, focusing on the theme "Seekers in Sneakers: Discover Jesus." This journey of discovery has many twists and turns which will give children the opportunity to grow through asking questions, working together, shining their light in the world, gaining insight from the Bible, and trusting Jesus.

When you register your child, please indicate how you will support VBS as a volunteer. We need plenty of adults to help during the week. There are also opportunities for parents who work outside the home during the day to support VBS in other ways; you'll find those on the registration form as well.

VBS is also supported by youth volunteers and many adults of all ages in our parish (not just parents). VBS is truly an inter-generational undertaking. If you are a young person or adult who is not registering a child, you can indicate your interest in volunteering using a different form.

VBS at St. Stephen's is for children age 3 (toilet-trained) through grade 5. Registration closes May 19 (or sooner, if we reach capacity). The cost is \$50 for one child and \$25 for each additional child in the same family, with a family cap of \$100.

**Periodicals: Parishes and Cathedrals** | **Seasons of the Spirit** received an honorable mention in this category, for an edition that included articles by John Rohrs, Cate Anthony, Diana Chou, and others; Sarah Bartenstein was the editor and freelancer Steven Longstaff the graphic designer.

Episcopal Communicators, an international group of communications professionals, celebrated the 50th anniversary of their founding at this year's conference which included workshops on a wide range of topics, from crisis communications to social media strategies to an introduction to Episcopal polity.
