the fruit of your womb, Jesus.

**Holy Mary, Mother of God: pray for us sinners,
now, and at the hour of our death.**

Officiant On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ
took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke
it, and gave it to his disciples, and said,

All **"Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do
this for the remembrance of me."**

Officiant After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had
given thanks, he gave it to them, and said,

All **"Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new
Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the
forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it do this for
the remembrance of me."**

*All are welcome to come forward to receive the Sacrament, after
which we observe one minute of silence, seated or kneeling.*
