Coming soon: familiar faces during a celebration of women in the priesthood

Next weekend St. Stephen's Church will mark the 50th anniversary of the first ordinations of women as Episcopal priests with special activities that welcome back women who have served St. Stephen's Church in the past: **the Rev. Margaret Austin**, **the Rev. Weezie Blanchard**, **the Rev. Claudia Merritt**, and **the Rev. Penny Nash.**

On July 29, 1974, eleven female Episcopal deacons became the first to be ordained as priests in the Episcopal Church. The service, which took place at the Church of the Advocate in Philadelphia, was the culmination of a prolonged effort to break the "stained-glass ceiling," and this summer marks the 50th anniversary of that historic event. These ordinations were considered "irregular" since the General Convention of the Episcopal Church had not yet opened the priesthood to women, but these women—who came to be known as the "Philadelphia Eleven"—and the retired bishops who ordained them helped lead the way for the convention to open the priesthood and episcopate to women two years later.

Our weekend-long celebration will include the screening of a documentary about the Philadelphia Eleven on Friday evening, a

morning retreat and lunch for women on Saturday; and guest preachers and speakers on Sunday. In addition to Margaret, Weezie, Claudia, and Penny, our events will include **the Rev. Cate Anthony**, associate rector, and **the Rev. Whitney Edwards**, vicar of Varina Church and a former chaplain at St. Christopher's School.

All events are free, but advance registration is needed. For details, pick up a flyer at Information Central outside the church office, or visit **ststephensRVA.org/womens-ordination**.
